- Subject to agreement from OPALDirector (Bob Griffiths to action), WG circulate
 OPAL consultation and feed back comments from APP TF to Bob Griffiths
- WG circulate full Natural Buzz evaluation when completed. Pass on Rhos Goch case study to WG Glastir teams, and Schools case study to WG 21st Century school team.
- NRW develop guidance based on recognition of value of existing grassland, for example as habitat for solitary mining bees (assess habitats before taking action)

- WG circulate to APP TF published results of road verge management projects, and circulate Russell Hobson? paper on pollinator road kill monitoring
- ALL feed back to WG ideas proposing areas that would be suitable WG Road Verges for Wildflowers Initiative
- James Byrne circulate Wildlife Trusts green infrastructure brochure; and circulate Clapham Park Estate Case Study and Parc Peulwys?
- WG –report back on bee health issues. In particular how Slovenia have been able to ban the import of bees (classed an "an indigenous insect" and not "an economic insect")
- NRW alongside Health Boards paper, develop more general paper for all new bodies that will be have proposed new biodiversity duty under the Environment Bill, showing how pollinator friendly action can help meet that new duty
- NRW/WG arrange workshop for Health Board grounds maintenance staff in spring 2016
- NRW circulate NRW grounds maintenance contract as a model for other public authorities.
- WG circulate presentations given to workshops with housing associations
- All provide feedback to WG on (i) Love Pollinators paper and (ii) Education sub group report
- WG circulate latest state of play on SUDS guidance and if this includes green roofs Note: current position is that following consultation, the SUDS Standards are complete and due to go to the Minister shortly, with a view to publication by mid-January).
