- Caryn Le Roux welcomed members to the meeting, thanked them for their contributions to producing the Action Plan for Pollinators, launched in July, and welcomed the goodwill and willingness for members to get engaged in carrying out practical tasks to further the action plan.
- 2. Diana Reynolds highlighted the Minister's request for everyone to get involved in doing things, and that this meeting would take the form of co-production, where everyone who feels they can contribute to or lead actions, is encouraged to do so. 'Start anywhere follow it everywhere'
- 3. The first agenda item was to discuss ways of working and principles for action. Output produced from this discussion in small groups was incorporated into a **draft Terms of Reference**.
- 4. During this discussion it became clear that there were a number of topics arising which members would like to discuss further in small groups.
- 5. These were:
 - Sustainable bees -Beekeeping sustaining native colonies and queens for beekeeping and commercial bumblebees.
 - Roadside verges/communications
 - Wildlife gardening

- Evidence, case studies, research
- 6. Some groups were at a stage to be able to continue the discussion further with an agreed lead: Sustainable bees, Roadside verges. Others felt that an overarching action would help progress the work on those areas at this point: Wildlife gardening, Evidence. A further action for the purpose of reviewing Glastir was agreed.
- 7. A number of actions arose from the feedback from these groups, see Action Points table.
- 8. It was agreed to review **the Implementation Plan** in the light of the morning's discussions.
- 9. The meeting closed for lunch. A follow up meeting was held in the afternoon by the Sustainable Bees group, and a related meeting was also held in the afternoon to discuss the development of an App regarding pollinators (see separate **note of meeting**).
